Graystone Farm & Stone's Throw Activities Participation Waiver

All activities offered at Graystone Farm and Stone's Throw, including but not limited to horseback riding, zip lines, low ropes course, fishing, and hiking, are designed with safety in mind but also carry certain risk factors that cannot be eliminated completely. Young children are not allowed within 50 feet of the pond without adult supervision. Children younger than 4 or weighing less than 35 pounds are not allowed on the zip lines. The required safety equipment for any activity must be worn at all times.

In consideration of the services and activities at Graystone Farm & Stone's Throw, their agents, officers, volunteers, land owners, participants, employees, and all other persons or entities acting in any capacity on their behalf (hereinafter collectively referred to as GFST, I hereby agree to release and discharge GFST, on behalf of myself, my children, parents, heirs, assigns, personal representatives and estate as follows:

1. I acknowledge that participation in the activities offered by GFST entail known and unanticipated risks that could result in physical or emotional injury, death, damage to property or to third parties. I understand that such risks cannot be eliminated completely from these activities. While GFST stresses safety in every way, they and the equipment used, are not infallible.
2. I expressly agree and promise to accept and assume all risks existing with all activities at GFST. My child's participation in this activity is purely voluntary, and I elect to allow my child to participate in spite of the risks. I recognize that GFST adheres to a philosophy of "challenge by choice" and that my child has the right to not participate in any activity during the event.
3. I hereby voluntarily release, forever discharge, and agree to indemnify and hold harmless GFST from any and all claims, demands, or causes of action, which are in any way connected with my child's participation in these activities, or their use of GFST equipment or facilities.
4. I certify that I have adequate insurance to cover any injury or damage my child may cause or suffer while participating, or else I agree to bear the costs of such damage or injury myself. I further certify that my child has no medical or physical conditions, which could interfere with their safety in these activities, or else I am willing to assume - and bear the costs of - all risks that may be created, directly or indirectly, by any such condition.
5. I agree that if any portion of this agreement is found to be void or unenforceable, the remaining portion shall remain in full force and effect.
6. I'm aware that GFST requires strict adherence to its standards of safety and conduct. I and my child agree to fully abide by these standards or to accept dismissal for refusing to adhere to them. I hereby grant GFST the right to use for promotional purposes only any photographs taken of my child during their participation in any activities at GFST.
7. **WARNING:** Under North Carolina Law, an equine activity sponsor or equine professional is not liable for an injury to or the death of a participant in equine activities resulting exclusively from the inherent risks of equine activities. Chapter 99E of the North Carolina General Statutes.
8. By signing this document, I acknowledge that if my child is hurt or property is damaged during participation in this activity, I may be found by a court of law to have waived my right to maintain a lawsuit against GFST on the basis of any claim from which I have released them. I have had sufficient opportunity to read this entire document, I have read and understood it, including the General Information page and agree to be bound by its terms.

GENERAL INFORMATION

NOTE: Please review the "Rules of the Farm for Campers" (on page 4) with your child before they attend camp.

HOURS: 8:30AM - 4:30PM (Summer Camp) / 8:00AM—3:00 PM (Holiday and Teacher Workday Camps)

DAYS: Weekly Camps = Monday thru Thursday

Daily Camps = Based on school closure dates

FEES: Weekly Camps = \$175.00

Daily Camps = \$35.00 per day

DEPOSIT: Weekly Summer Camps = A \$50.00 non-refundable deposit is due with your application.

All other Camps = Payment is due in full 2 weeks in advance or at the time of enrollment if less than 2 weeks.

BALANCE: The balance of your weekly camp fee is due 2 weeks prior to the start of camp.

DROP OFF & PICK UP POLICY: Campers may arrive up to 15 minutes prior to the start of the camp day and should be picked up within 15 minutes of camp ending, unless extended care services have been requested in advance.

SAFETY APPAREL FOR RIDING: Certified Riding Helmets are required for all equine activities, and are provided at the farm. You may choose to bring your personal bike helmet for the zip lines or use one of ours. Boots with a smooth sole and at least a half inch heel are required for all campers old enough to put their feet in the stirrups. While boots are not required for riders who do not put their feet in the stirrups, they do provide more protection while working on the ground around the horses. Jeans or riding pants are required for all campers age 7 and older to prevent saddle pinching at more advanced gaits. Shorts may be worn for all other activities. Younger campers may ride in shorts.

CLOTHING: Campers should wear comfortable clothes, shoes and socks. Sandals or open toed shoes are not allowed. Low cut tops are not allowed. All shorts must come at least to mid-thigh. We highly recommend leaving a change of clothes in your child's locker, including underwear and socks for younger campers. Campers may change into shorts and athletic shoes after riding.

BOOTS OR SNEAKERS WITH BLACK SOLES ARE NOT ALLOWED ON THE INDOOR PLAY AREA FLOOR: Please wear your athletic shoes to camp and bring your boots to change into when it is your turn to ride.

LOCKERS: Lockers are provided for the campers and they should keep all of their personal items in their locker at all times. Our staff is not responsible for lost or misplaced items. Campers are not permitted to put locks on their lockers.

SNACKS: Two snacks and beverages are provided each day.

LUNCH: Campers should bring their own food and beverage for lunch. Please use a cold pack in your child's lunch box to keep food and beverages cold. Lunches must be kept in your child's locker. There is not ample space in the refrigerator for all campers to keep their lunch. We suggest that campers bring a labeled water bottle during hot summer months.

NOT ALLOWED: Graystone Farm does not allow profanity, weapons of any type including pocket knives, disrespect of staff or other campers, toys, electronic games, cell phones, ipods, mp3 players, clothing with inappropriate pictures or wording, revealing clothing, and chewing gum.

DISCIPLINE POLICY: For the safety and enjoyment of all campers, we will not tolerate improper behavior or attitude. Our policy is: 1st time - warning, 2nd time - parent called, 3rd time - sent home for the day.

“RULES OF THE FARM FOR CAMPERS”

The following rules are designed to insure that each camper has a pleasant and safe experience while here at our farm. Parents, please go over these rules with your child prior to their arrival at camp. Refusal to follow rules and directions given by staff will result in campers not being allowed to participate in activities.

1. Be polite and respectful to fellow campers, staff, and camp director at all times.
2. When the director or a counselor is giving instructions, please pay attention and keep your eyes and ears on the person speaking so as to not delay or disrupt the activity.
3. During group activities please raise your hand and wait until called upon to speak. This way everyone is not talking at once and we can hear what you have to say.
4. Show good sportsmanship when participating in group games and activities.
5. Campers are not allowed in the parking area or near the road.
6. Chewing gum is not allowed.
7. Keep all personal items in your locker at all times.
8. Campers are expected to pick up after themselves and throw away their trash.
9. If you go to the rest room be sure to let someone know where you are.
10. Keep the rest room clean and neat. Boys should use the urinal.
11. Food must stay in your locker except during snack and lunch time. Campers are free to get water at any time. We suggest bringing a labeled water bottle each day with a carrying strap or clip for hikes away from the barn. Be prepared to carry your own bottle.
12. Do not feed the animals without permission.
13. Do not run inside of the barn.
14. Do not wear black soled shoes on the indoor game area floor.
15. When on hikes away from the barn you must stay together with your group and leader.
16. Campers must NEVER go to the pond area alone or without a staff member present.
17. Zip line riders must never adjust or remove climbing harness or helmet. If adjustments need to be made, have a staff member make the changes.
18. DO NOT put your hands on the zip line cable when in motion, unless you are an older camper wearing the proper gloves and have been taught how to break by a staff member.
19. Campers are not allowed on the low ropes obstacles marked by a flag without staff supervision.
20. Do not run up to, make loud noises around, or walk behind, the horses.
21. Be quiet around all the animals and be gentle. Do not pull on or chase the cats!
22. Do not open cage or stall doors.
23. Helmets must be worn when riding horses and zip lines, no exceptions.
24. We do not allow: Profanity, disrespect of people or property, weapons of any type (including pocket knives), toys from home, electronic games, cell phones, ipods, mp3 players, clothing with inappropriate pictures or wording, or revealing clothing.
25. DISCIPLINE POLICY: Campers are expected to follow all written rules and any others given by the Director. Failure to do so will result in the following: 1st time - camper receives warning. 2nd time - parent is called. 3rd time - camper is sent home for the day.
